- 3) The Liminal Spaces, where memory, history, and personal need merge, with often unexpected results.

WRITER'S NOTE

Sometimes your phone rings, and answering the call unlocks a future that you did not anticipate. I received such a call from Nadia Pillay, almost two years ago. She wanted me to meet Chuck Bowen.

I answered the call - and my life changed.

I was always a student of Chicago's history. I spent my career chronicling the lives of my family, my city, it's sometimes violent clashes of culture, race, class, and the politics interwoven therein. Meeting Chuck Bowen and the subsequent 6 months of interviews that we undertook together, turned my understanding upside down. I feel as though my creative life was the training ground that prepared me to meet the man and to grapple with the first-hand knowledge of his life inside the power structures of our city.

It has been the privilege of my life to have been invited into his company, and further still to have had the opportunity to engage with him about so much history that was unknown to me prior. This play represents but a fraction of what we explored together. It would take a cycle of plays to adequately cover the century plus of context needed to tell this story. In the end—there were so many amazing stories that were left on the cutting room floor.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Before I was done writing the first draft of *Machine Made*, I was on the phone with my "mentor and theater papa," Chuck Smith. "Chuck," I said, "I have the perfect play for you. I need an experienced director who loves this city, and understands Black life here - first hand. I need someone in Chuck Bowen's peer group. Someone who understands the unspoken language of experience."

Chuck Smith moved a few things around, and I had my perfect director, married to the perfect conversation about our living history. Unfortunately, Chuck Smith had to attend to the pressing matters of his personal health, but before he took a step back he shared - "You understand this world better than anyone. You are the bridge between these two viewpoints."

And with that I stepped into the director's chair of *Machine Made*. The talent assembled to bring this world together is stellar. It was yet another privilege to collaborate with them and bring forth a layered story that was greater than any of us could have told alone.

At the core of this play is a story about the relationship of two people. Through them, we get a better look at how history is not behind us, but rather it is present even now, shaping how we talk to each other, care for one another, and move through our shared spaces.

PRODUCTION



Shepsu Aakhu (Playwright/Director) A founding member, has penned over 30 critically acclaimed world-premiere works for MPAACT. Among them are: Ride or Die; Red Summer; Spoken Word; Black & Blue; Never the Milk & Honey; By Association; and Starting Over. Shepsu is a 2-time recipient of the Ted Ward Prize (Ten Square & Kiwi

Black), a 2-time Artistic Fellow in Scriptworks (Illinois Arts Council - 2019 and 2004), a 7-time nominee for Best Original Work (BTAA) with awards for The Abesha Conspiracy and Trouble The Water. He is a 6-time nominee for the Joseph Jefferson Citation, with awards for Best New Work (Speaking in Tongues/Babel), and Original Music (Kosi Dasa and Kimi Black). Cop Out! and Evolve premiered for Red Door Theater (Portland, OR) in 2018 with writing credits shared by Shepsu and several Chicago writers. Currently, Shepsu has The Companion, the stage adaptation of his epic feature length-film on the Namibian holocaust in development at Georgetown University.

Several of Shepsu's plays are available in audio at (MPAACTPLAYS.COM) and in print media - The BlaQ Market (Sakhu) and Seven Black Plays (Northwestern Univ. Press). In digital print media, Shepsu serves as editor-inchief and as a regular contributor for Listen magazine - the companion magazine for podcast plays (the audio multiverse). Independent film projects abound with longtime collaborator Mark Spencer (Masmedia) including the 2024 premiere of One Thousand Negative Confessions. Content for television and film continues in development with producing partners J. David Shanks and Phillip Edward Van Lear. Shepsu recently served as a writer for series television with AMC/Charter, and HBO.
